*Jackie Walker* gave up full time work in 1989 in international banking to become a full time painter and has never looked back. She has a particular interest in the effect of light on matter and in capturing mood and atmosphere. Jackie has exhibited widely including the Mall galleries.

Some 60 works from these painters will be featured and prints and paintings will be available to buy from the art marquee. Works from other local artists will also be available (**All weekend 10am-5pm**).

#### The Walks:

##### Sat 4th July 11.30am

A guided Downland walk through the Beech woods of Bignor Hill up to the top, with stops on the way to admire the views and to rest. The 360° views are astounding (about 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hours).

##### Sat 4th July 3.00pm

A herbal stroll opposite the church through a stream edged woodland path, guided by an enthusiastic medical herbalist. Nettles, dandelions and elder have valuable uses- find out more. (about 3/4 hour)

##### Sun 5th July 11.30am

A guided Wealden walk. The flora and fauna, the birdsong and their recognition will all form part of the walk. A valuable insight into the countryside that will enlighten your future walks.

##### Sun 5th July 2.00pm

Another herbal stroll similar to Saturday's. Both walks will have an introductory talk beforehand.

*(Walks start from the church lychgate)*

#### The Evening:

##### Sound, light, fire and water. Quite magical.

The displays in the church will take on a new aura with special effect lighting and music to enhance a most moving experience.

Outside, as the sun drops towards the horizon, the sky will be lit up when the charcoal burner lets off steam and opens the kiln, to be followed by fire dancing and fire juggling as the evening wears into oblivion.

### **The Music:**



Under the shade of a 1000 year old yew tree the 15 strong Sussex Folk Orchestra, with their repertoire of traditional country music played on a wide variety of instruments, will give a lovely additional sense of Englishness to the event **(All weekend 10am-5pm).**

### **The Poetry:**



Sussex, with the South Downs and its countryside, has given much inspiration to poets and musicians alike. Some of our best loved poems will be on display amongst the gravestones. In the tea garden there will be readings **(Poetry reading Sun 5th 3pm).**

### **The Food:**



A day out in the country, especially at the Weed Festival, would not be the same without good wholesome grub. The ladies of the village will provide some scrumptious cream teas and home-made cakes. The licensed bar will serve local ale and wine. There will be herbal tea tastings; spit roasted South Downs Lamb; “the most delicious lamb baguette ever” (Mrs C) and demonstrations on how to cook wild food **(All weekend 10am-5pm).**

### **Wildflower drawing and painting masterclasses**

Antonia Dundas specialises in botanical art and the flora and fauna of the Downs. Bring along a sketch pad and spend some relaxing time, under guidance, drawing (and painting) the churchyard or venture out into the surrounding fields and woods **(Saturday and Sunday afternoons).**
